- 5. Authorize the City Administrator to annually provide a letter of authorization to the Tulare County Environmental Health Department for inclusion in the regional annual grant application through the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) on behalf of the City of Exeter to help continue funding the county wide Household Hazardous Waste and Used Oil collection.

1. Authorize the City Administrator to enter into a 5-year License Agreement with the County of Tulare for the installation of an Official Ballot Drop Box at City Hall, at no cost to the City, subject to minor conforming or clarifying changes as acceptable to the City Attorney. City Administrator Adam Ennis provided a brief PowerPoint presentation highlighting the proposed Official Ballot Drop Box and locations for Council's review and consideration. Following discussion, it was moved by Council Member Hails, seconded by Council Member Alves and unanimously carried to authorize the City Administrator to enter into a 5-year License Agreement with the County of Tulare for installation of an Official Ballot Drop Box at City Hall subject to minor conforming or clarifying changes as acceptable to the City Attorney with the location placement adjacent to the City's parking lot.

Council Member Alves reported on attending the TCAG meeting. Mayor Pro Tem Sally reported on attending the Exeter Chamber of Commerce Board meeting and commented on the upcoming Coffee with a Cop. Department Recommendation:

Staff recommends that Council approve the construction contract change order and appropriation as presented.

Summary/Background:

At its regularly scheduled meeting on December 10, 2019, the Council awarded and authorized the City Administrator to sign a contract with Lyles Utility Construction, LLC of Fresno, CA in the amount of \$42,892 to preform emergency replacements of four water distribution system valves.

Efforts to isolate valves for replacement identified in the original scope of work resulted in three additional water valves needing replacement. Also, in anticipation of the Palm Ave. Reconstruction Project, an out of date fire hydrant located on the south side of Palm Avenue between A Street and B Street was also identified as needing to be replaced. At its regularly scheduled meeting on February 25, 2020, the Council approved Change Order 001 in the amount of \$49,498.20 for this extra work. This change order did not include the cost of asphalt replacement. Subsequently, COO 2 in the amount of \$7,985.85 was issued and approved by the City Administrator on June 18, 2020. Because the dollar amount was well within the City Administrator's purchasing limits, this change order was not taken to Council.

As work continued and efforts to isolate the additional valve replacement locations failed, staff expanded their shut down area and attempted to close additional valves. As a result, five (5) additional valves broke and/or became inoperable. Staff was forced to make some immediate decisions in the field in order to isolate certain areas and keep the project moving forward.

A total of twelve (12) non-working water distribution system valves were required to be replaced as part of this project. Nine (10) of these valves were located on Palm Ave. With the reconstruction of Palm Ave. now underway, the timing of these valve replacements was critical. With the project now complete, crews have the ability to effectively isolate areas of the City that otherwise would not have been possible.

Fiscal Impact: As part of the fiscal year 20/21 Budget, \$75,000 was appropriated for capital projects related to the City's water lines (Capital Project #105.461.080.009). This project's appropriation will be utilized from that existing fiscal year 2020/2021 budget appropriation. With a previous appropriation transfer authorized in fiscal year 2020/2021, this will leave a remaining balance of \$74.75 in project #105.461.080.009 for Water Pipe Repair for use during fiscal year 2020/2021.

Prior Council/Board Actions: December 10, 2019, the Council awarded and authorized the City Administrator to sign a contract with Lyles Utility Construction, LLC of Fresno, CA in the amount of \$42,892 to preform emergency replacements of the four water distribution system valves.

February 25, 2020, the Council approved construction contract change order for additional water distribution valve and a fire hydrant assembly replacements and appropriated \$49,498.20 from the water capital expenditure account 105.461.073 for FY 19/20 to fund the change orders.

Summary:

With the construction phase of the E. Palm Street Reconstruction Project now underway, the contractor has encountered, among other shallow utilities, certain City waterlines located within the project area that are too shallow for the full depth asphalt reclamation work and alley approach improvements to proceed as planned. For this reason, the waterlines must be lowered for the E. Palm Street Reconstruction Project to continue without delay.

Upon encountering this issue, a project scope was developed for the waterline lowering and reconstruction. All of the City's pre-qualified contractors were contacted, provided the scope of work, and given an opportunity to bid on this utility project. Only one bid response was received from the following pre-qualified contractor:

Lyles Utility, LLC.

\$71,543

Some additional work, such as concrete patching and paving, will be required after the watermain lowering is complete. The additional work will be addressed through change orders for the E. Palm Street Reconstruction Project contract with AJ Excavation.

Background: At the City Council meeting of April 23, 2019, the Exeter City Council accepted a list of five pre-qualified contractors to perform repair and rehabilitation projects on the City's water distribution and sanitary and storm sewer collection systems and authorized the City Administrator to execute initial agreements with each contactor. Table 1 shows the list of qualified contractors approved at that meeting.

The executed initial agreements with all of the above contractors put in place everything necessary that did not require the specific scope of work for a particular project. This qualified contractor list and initial agreements has already proven to be very effective in addressing immediate smaller scale construction needs for the City and the work already completed through this procedure has reduced system vulnerabilities.

Fiscal Impact: With this authorization an additional appropriation of \$78,697 would be included into the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) in the Water Fund (105). This would be taken from projected fund balance of approximately \$400,000 as of July 1, 2020 as shown in the 2020/2021 Budget.

 directed. The Owner shall be obligated to disclose all potential lien rights and/or financing party
 information on the property.
- 2. This proposal is conditioned upon the use of standard terms and conditions, or application thereof, of the Associated General Contractors (AGC) General Contract Agreement. We reserve the right to suggest and make contractual changes to any contract documents with good faith and direct negotiations.
- 3. This proposal includes costs for typical insurance policies: General Liability (2 million / 4 million) and Auto (2 million) with Additional insured as requested along with standard workers compensation or any payment of deductibles may be at an additional cost.

Summary/Background:

At its regularly scheduled meeting on May 19, 2020 the Council awarded a contract to AJ Excavation in the amount of \$1,291,819 for construction of the E. Palm Street Reconstruction Project, STPL-5195(022).

With construction now underway, it has been discovered that some of the gas lines located within the project area are too shallow for the full depth asphalt reclamation work to proceed as planned. For this reason, staff has been working with representatives from Southern California Gas Company to develop a plan for them to relocate their shallow lines so that there are no delays in construction.

One of the shallow lines that must be addressed is located at the intersection of Palm and F Street. In this intersection there is a tee for a high-pressure gas line that runs south on F Street, from Palm towards Pine Street. This is the gas service line that supplies the Exeter Chamber of Commerce building. Because it's not typical for a single building to be served by a highpressure gas main, and requirements and timing for relocating a high-pressure gas main are considerable, Southern California Gas Company has proposed to abandon this line and supply the Chamber building from the medium-pressure gas line that runs through the alley behind City Hall. Doing so would require them to bore from the alley to F Street under the sidewalk along the south side of the City owned parking lot south of City Hall to make the connection. The only excavation required would occur at the connection points in the alley and F Street. To make this option possible, the City must grant a utility easement to Southern California Gas Company before they can proceed with the work. The gas line would be located approximately 11.5 feet north of the south property line with the easement extending 5 feet on each side of the line. The easement would be non-exclusive, continuing to allow the City to use the ground surface for features such as parking and landscaping but no large trees, buildings or other structures that would limit Southern California Gas Company's access to their line.

Fiscal Impact: The execution of this utility easement agreement will have no fiscal impact on the City. All costs associated with installation, maintenance, and repair of the gas line within the easement will be covered by the Southern California Gas Company.

WHEREAS, the City of Exeter owns and occupies certain real property identified as APN 138-102-017 located at 137 North F Street (City Hall); and

WHEREAS, a shallow high pressures gas main running through the intersection of Palm and F Streets must be abandoned to allow completion of the East Palm Street Improvement Project and the abandonment requires that a gas connection be made through the City Hall Property from the alley to F Street; and

WHEREAS, the City of Exeter desires to grant a 10 feet wide non-exclusive utility easement to Southern California Gas Company, a subsidiary of Sempra Energy, to bore a medium pressure gas main under the sidewalk along the south side of the City owned parking lot south of City Hall; and

WHEREAS, the proposed gas line would be located approximately 11.5 feet north of the south property line of APN 138-102-017 with the easement extending 5 feet on each side of the line. The easement would be non-exclusive, continuing to allow the City to use the ground surface for features such as parking and landscaping but no large trees, buildings or other structures that would limit Southern California Gas Company's access to their line.

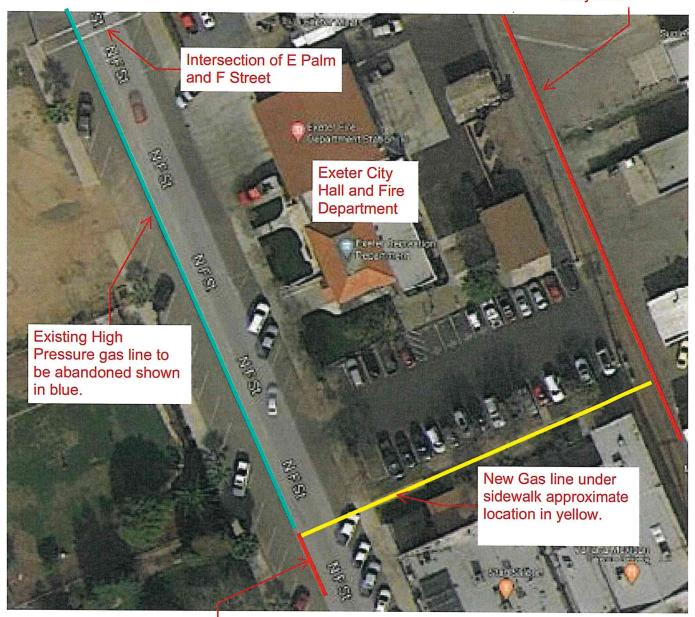

Summary/Background:

The City of Exeter and Tulare County Transportation Authority has discussed programming of approximately \$6.5 million of Measure R Regional funding for the cost of design, right of way, environmental clearance, construction and construction engineering for the Visalia Road Improvements Project, Phase 1. To receive this funding, the City must execute an updated Measure R Supplemental Agreement with the Tulare County Transportation Authority.

The project includes a full street reconstruction of the existing roadway on Visalia Road from approximately Jacobs Place to Orange Avenue. The construction also includes, but is not limited to, construction of accessible ramps, curb, gutter, sidewalk, drive approaches, median curb, bus turnout, adjusting utilities to grade, storm drainage, water line replacement, lift station relocation, traffic signal modification, street lighting, landscaping and irrigation, signing, striping, and pavement markings, and other miscellaneous improvements and appurtenances.

The City of Exeter advertised the Request for Bids for this project and received five construction bids on August 13, 2020. Yarbs Grading & Paving of Fresno, CA submitted the apparent low bid of \$4,109,961.00.

The following is a summary of the construction bids that were received:

Yarbs Grading & Drainage
AJ Excavation.
Granite Construction

\$4,109,961.00 \$4,298,849.50 \$4,364,620.25 The design engineer's final Opinion of Probable Construction Cost was \$4,205,689.31. A table of total project costs is shown in Table 1 below.

Yarbs Grading & Paving bid proposal for this project has been reviewed by staff and all required information submitted has been determined to be complete and responsive.

Fiscal Impact:

This road project is fully funded by Measure R. Concurrent with the construction contract execution, staff will work with TCTA to execute a Measure R Supplemental Agreement to secure this funding for the project. Measure R will fund approximately \$6.5 million of all phases of the project, with the City contributing \$170,000 for 50% of the lift station relocation costs from the City's Sewer Fund. The additional appropriation of \$116,700 will bring the total Measure R Fund (131) appropriation to \$5,156,000 in 2020/2021 for the construction phase and \$170,000 total appropriation in the Sewer Fund (107).

Summary/Background:

The City of Exeter and the Tulare County Transportation Authority (TCTA) has discussed programming of up to \$6.5 million of Measure R Regional funding for the cost of design, right of way, environmental clearance, construction and construction engineering for the Visalia Road Improvement Project, Phase 1. To receive this funding, the City must execute an updated Measure R Supplemental Agreement with the Tulare County Transportation Authority. Authorization for this is being requested from the Council as part of the construction contract award item.

The project includes a full street reconstruction of the existing roadway on Visalia Road from approximately Jacobs Place to Orange Avenue. The construction also includes, but is not limited to, construction of accessible ramps, curb, gutter, sidewalk, drive approaches, median curb, bus turnout, adjusting utilities to grade, storm drainage, water line replacement, lift station relocation, traffic signal modification, street lighting, landscaping and irrigation, signing, striping, and pavement markings, and other miscellaneous improvements and appurtenances.

As we move forward into the construction phase of the project the City must select and hire a qualified firm to be responsible for construction management services. Construction management duties include monitoring the construction for contract document compliance, project schedule and delivery, requests for information, change orders, proper construction, certified payroll, dispute resolution, project acceptance, payments, and closing of the contract. Having appropriate construction management services is critical to the successful delivery of a project.

On July 22, 2020, staff advertised a request for proposals (RFP) for construction management services for the project. Proposals were due by August 13th. As of the deadline, two proposals were received from the following two firms:

4 Creeks – Visalia, CA Ghirardelli Associates – San Jose, CA Both proposals were reviewed and evaluated by the City's Internal Selection Committee. Each proposal was scored on a zero to 100 point rating system. Each score of the evaluation criteria was then multiplied according to their assigned weight to arrive at a weighted score for each proposal. Table I, Visalia Road Widening Project Proposals, shows the scoring of the initial proposal evaluation:

Based on the above scoring, it is staff's recommendation that the City proceed with negotiating an agreement with 4Creeks Engineering to provide construction management services for the Visalia Road Widening Project.

With this Council approval, City Staff can negotiate with 4Creeks to obtain an executed agreement and the City can move forward into the construction phase of this project.

Fiscal Impact:

Upon Council approval and prior to construction contract execution, staff will work with TCTA to execute an updated Measure R Supplemental Agreement to secure the funding for the construction phase of the project. An agreement with TCTA will make available all funding to complete construction of this project including construction and construction engineering for the Visalia Road Improvements Project, Phase 1. The contract will be paid for from this project as approved in the 2020/2021 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) and amended as needed in separate Council action with the construction contract award. Funding is to come from project # 131.497.080.026 in the Measure R Fund.

Prior Council/Board Actions: Numerous prior Council actions pertaining to funding, preliminary engineering, right of way and Plans, Specifications and Estimates (PS&E).

Summary:

On March 24, 2020 the Council adopted Resolution 2020-12 proclaiming the existence of a local emergency due to the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) subsequent to emergencies being declared by the United States Department of Public Health and Human Service, the State and County. In the last week Tulare County reports that there have been about 120,000 tests completed, 14,000 confirmed cases and 230 deaths. A little over half of the deaths resulting from skilled nursing home cases. There are currently about 275 confirmed cases in Exeter.

In addition to the medical impacts listed above, many local businesses categorized as non-essential by County and State orders were closed or at reduced services for many weeks resulting in loss of income and employee layoffs. In addition, bars and gyms remain closed and restaurants are limited to take out, delivery and outside dining options in an attempt to reduce spread of the virus. This is and will have a significant impact on the local economy and the City revenues. In addition, the effects of this pandemic on the investment markets will have an impact on the economy, City revenues and future CalPERS unfunded liabilities.

The City has developed and distributed a no cost encroachment permit process and conditions for use of the public right-of-way along business frontages to assist in continuing and maximizing business operations as much as possible. Additional options to assist local businesses through this pandemic are currently being discussed with the Chamber of Commerce and local community groups. The City will continue to assist where possible on any potential options. In addition, several programs have been developed through the County and State using CARES ACT funding to financially assist businesses.

Preparing for, responding to, mitigating, and recovering from the spread of COVID-19 has and will continue to require the City to divert resources from normal day-to-day operations and impose extraordinary requirements on and expenses to the City. Since the pandemic began affecting Tulare County and the declaration of a local emergency, the City Administrator took administrative actions to address State, County and local emergency declarations, guidance and orders and ensure continuity of service to the community and staff safety.

Staff has prepared City lobbies to meet current orders and guidance and have reopened them with City Hall lobby hours being 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and Publics Works lobby hours from 7am to

3pm, both Monday through Friday. Reopening these lobbies required that policies be prepared, modifications made to the facilities and staff trained. So far, the City has spent about \$37,000 on sanitizing, personal protective equipment, technology for virtual meetings and retrofitting City facilities for social distancing measures in order to reopen. In addition, the annual revenues from recreation programs has decreased upwards of \$35,000.

Staff recommends continuing the state of emergency established by Resolution 2020-12 since additional future requirements, needs and costs are likely and the potential for future reimbursement exists that could depend on an emergency declaration being in place. If the declaration is continued it must be reviewed again in 60 days, which would have to occur by November 7th.

Background:

COVID-19 is a respiratory disease which the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) considers to be a very serious public health threat with outcomes ranging from mild to severe sickness and death. On March 4, 2020, Governor Newsom declared a state of emergency in the State of California due to the number of confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the state. On March 12, 2020, Tulare County declared an emergency due to the confirmed case of COVID-19 at Sierra View Medical Center in the City of Porterville.

Fiscal Impact: At this point the City has spent about \$37,000 on sanitizing, personal protective equipment, technology for virtual meetings and retrofitting City facilities for social distancing measures in order to reopen. In addition, the annual revenues from recreation programs has decreased upwards of \$35,000.

The potential future financial impacts of this virus are unknown at this time but could vary depending on the level of resources, and associated costs, that are required to be expended by the City and the effect on future revenues due to impacts on the local economy. The total potential for assistance to the City and community from State and Federal resources for these impacts are still unknown at this time and their availability could be dependent on whether a City declaration of emergency is in place or not.

The City has received two of the four total disbursements of CARES ACT funding through the State for costs incurred to meet orders and guidance. The total CARES ACT funding available to the City is about \$136,000 and requires staff to develop and provide documentation to the State justifying the City receiving these disbursements. Staff anticipates submitting the \$37,000 in expenses mentioned above and about \$99,000 for "Preservation of Essential City Services for Residents", which is defined by the CARES ACT primarily as public safety services through the pandemic, for a total of about \$136,000. The State must then review the justifications to confirm the City's eligibility to receive the funding.

Prior Council/Board Actions: On March 24, 2020 the Council adopted Resolution 2020-12 proclaiming the existence of a local emergency due to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19).

On May 19 and July14, 2020 Council approved to continue the state of emergency established by Resolution 2020-12 due to the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) for an additional 60 days.

RESOLUTION 2020-12

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EXETER PROCLAIMING THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) is a respiratory disease which the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) consider to be a very serious public health threat with outcomes ranging from mild to severe sickness and death; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is easily transmissible from person to person and has spread globally to over 118 countries, infected more than 125,000, and killed more than 4,000 as of March 11, 2020 per the World Health Organization (WHO); and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Public Health and Human Services declared a public emergency for COVID-19 beginning on January 27, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency in the State of California due to the number of confirmed cases of COVID -19 in the State; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, WHO made the assessment that COVID-19 can be characterized as a pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, Tulare County declared an emergency due to the confirmed case of COVID-19 at Sierra View Medical Center in the City of Porterville, thus enabling Tulare County to take extraordinary measures, and since that date there have been 2 more confirmed cases at Kaweah Delta Medical Center in the City of Visalia;

WHEREAS, between the dates of March 13, 2020 and March 17, 2020, various State and Federal authorities have recommended that gatherings of more than 250, 50, or even 10 people should be avoided at least until the end of March; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 therefore will continue to cause conditions of peril to the health, safety, and welfare of person and property in the City of Exeter; and

WHEREAS, preparing for, responding to, mitigating, and recovering from the spread of COVID-19 requires the City to divert resources form normal day-to-day operations, and has and will continue to impose extraordinary requirements on and expenses to the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council here finds that the above described conditions related to the COVID-19 outbreak does warrant and necessitate the proclamation of the existence of a local emergency in the City of Exeter;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND DECLARED by the City Council of the City of Exeter;

- A local emergency is hereby proclaimed to exist throughout the City of Exeter. 1.
- The local emergency shall be deemed to continue to exist until its termination is 2. proclaimed by the City Council of the City of Exeter.
- As required by law, the City Council shall review the need to continue the state of emergency at least once every sixty (60) days until this Resolution is terminated.
